Literacy

This week we continue to focus on the children's letter formation when they are writing to ensure a good handwriting style. In phonics the children will be learning about the 'oi' sound. We will hear all the children read on Friday so please make sure you send their reading books in.

Understanding of the World

We will be looking at the origins of the teddy bear. The children will be talking about their own favourite cuddly toy and they will be sharing the story of where their cuddly toy comes from. Mathematics

This week we will be looking at odd and even numbers. The children will work on recognise odd and even numbers up to ten. We will explore how we recognise odd and even numbers and looking at a 100 square to help us recognise simple odd and even patterns. We will continue to explore the order of numbers and familiarise ourselves with the pattern of numbers to twenty. We will be ordering numbers and using our knowledge of number sequence to work out the missing numbers.
