Communication and Language

Hatchmere will discussing their trip to the zoo. They will explore their favourite animal and learn a fact about them. Hatchmere will be challenged to share their knowledge with their friends. Clear speech will be supported and modelled. The children will also be learning the rhyme 'The Animals Went in Two by Two'.

Literacy

Hatchmere will be completing some information writing this week. This will include a fact about their favourite animal. Hatchmere will be working on the digraph 'oa' (boat,foal)) alongside recapping our previously taught sounds. We will be using these sounds to support our speech and our writing.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will be working on their musical skills with Mrs Kelly on Tuesday afternoon. Hatchmere will be using watercolours to paint their hand-drawn transport pictures. Additionally, the children will continue to exploring marbling and how to create a personal piece of art.

Physical Development

The children will continue to practice the Cha Cha Slide and are working on their 'cha-cha' moves. Additionally, they are getting better at recognising their lefts and rights. Hatchmere will also use their fine motor control to master using chopsticks. The children will continue their dance and gymnastics lessons on a Thursday and Friday morning.

Personal Social and Emotion

Hatchmere will be discussing the expectations in our school that help to keep them safe. They will also explore whose responsibility it is to keep them safe both at school and at home.
