Communication and Language

Hatchmere will be exploring their new focus vocabulary and putting those words into a sentence that shows their understanding. The children will be supported to role-play in customer service; using a respectful tone, using manners, smiling and making eye contact. They will also be repeating 'orders' to ensure they are correct.

Physical Development

In P.E. the children will continue to work on their favourite sports day activities and organise their own equipment in order to complete it. They will be working in small teams to give instructions to others in order to complete the task. On Friday Hatchmere will be taught gymnastics by a specialist coach visiting the school.

Personal, Social and Emotion

This week's focus will be on change as the children talk about their transition visit to Year 1. We will take some time to sit down together and talk about our feeling, any worries and any other questions the children may have.

Literacy

Hatchmere Superheroes will be writing all about their super hero skill this week. Alongside this the children will be writing their comments for their end of year report. They will write about what they have enjoyed the most and what they are looking forward to in Year 1. In phonics this week the children will be re-visiting previously taught sounds and HFWs. A focus of this week will be CCC onset words (scrunch, split, strand).

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will continue with their music lessons with Miss Pile on Thursday mornings. The theme for these lessons will be 'African Animals'. The children will take part in lots of role-play activities this week alongside describing their Superhero power to an audience.

Hatchmere will be discussing the ways in which Muslims help within the community. Additionally, they will learn about Ramadan and listen to Rameen's experience.

Understanding of the World

The children have been particularly interested in Volcanoes recently. This week we will explore volcanoes around the world and how they work. We will link in with our discussions on Emergency Services and how they come together from all over the world to support when there is an eruption.

Mathematics

This week's focus is on assessing and deepening the children's understanding of how to compare quantities. The activities included will help you to check their comprehension and will provide opportunities for further comparison experiences. The children will have the opportunity to demonstrate these key skills: comparing groups of the same object with a big difference in number, and then a small difference; comparing by looking, then by matching 1-to-1; understanding when groups have an equal amount; comparing groups of objects that are of different sizes, colours or attributes; beginning to generalise about '1 more/1 less' within 10; developing a sense of magnitude, e.g. knowing that 8 is a lot more than 2, but that 4 is only a little bit more than 2.

Parental Involvement Task

Next week we will be assessing the children's ability to compare numbers to 10. This is another skill that can that can be practised anywhere! Ask them to compare 2 groups of objects, encourage the mathematical terms of more and fewer (there are more forks, there are fewer spoons). Give them a number and ask what is one more? What is one less?

Talk to your child about their transition to Year 1 in September. Talk positively about their upcoming visits to the Year 1 classroom and what they may be looking forward to.
