Guidance

Reading for pleasure is important in developing vocabulary, general knowledge and self-confidence as a reader. We have included some questions that you might like to ask while reading together to prompt further discussion and help your child to get the most out of this time. Where there is a blank space, fill this gap with a relevant word from the story; this might be the name of a character, a tricky word or a particular setting.

Questions to ask before reading	 Can you find the front cover? What can you see on the front cover? Can you find the title? What do you think the book might be about? Questions to ask after reading	 What happened in the story? What was your favourite part? Which character did you like the best? 	 Can you retell the story in your own words? What happened at the beginning of the story? What was your favourite part? Why? Who would you recommend this book to? 	 How did change throughout the book? Would you have changed the story? How? What questions would you ask the author? Who would you recommend this book to? Would you read another book by the author?
