THE British Hedgehog <u>Preservation</u> Society is asking people to think about how we can help hedgehogs while we are all spending more time at home.

Hedgehogs are one of the UK's most <u>familiar</u> and well-loved animals. They are always popping up in children's stories and films. But when did you last actually see one? Sadly, hedgehog numbers are falling quickly.

As more houses and building <u>developments</u> take over green spaces around the UK, hedgehogs are finding it harder and harder to <u>survive</u>. So why not try these five easy ideas to help our hedgehogs?

1. Make square holes at the bottom of fences or

walls (13cm square). This makes sure hedgehogs can move between gardens and helps to create a hedgehog highway!

- **2.** Create a log pile, which will provide <u>shelter</u> and food for hedgehogs.
- **3.** If you know there is a hedgehog in your garden, offer them meaty cat or dog food in the garden at night. You can create a simple <u>feeding station</u> so the food isn't stolen by cats and foxes!
- **4.** Leave <u>shallow</u> bowls of water in the garden for them to drink.
- **5.** Build a hedgehog home for them to nest in and use as a nursery.


