Physical Development

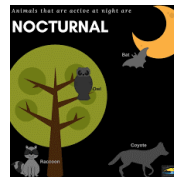
The children will be working on ball skills with Mrs Pile on Thursday morning. In the Outside classroom we will continue to work skipping skills and night-time dance routine.

Understanding of the World

We will be learning about animals that come out at night and why. The children will be exploring light and dark. We will be looking at shadows and how they are formed.

This week we are doing a couple of different activities with the children including a pyjama day where we share bedtime routine drink cocoa and listen to stories. At the end of the week the children will experience a campfire session where they will be able to toast marsh mallows and experience the sounds and smells of a real fire.

Mathematics

We will continue to consolidate numbers to five looking at one more and the patterns of addition. The children will be working on their number formation and subitising skills. We will be looking a positional language and understanding simple directions.
