Literacy

The children will be introduced to our new book 'The Squirrels that Squabbled' and explore the vocabulary within the book. In phonics we will be looking at the sounds c, k and ck.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will be moving like a fire work and listening to different firework music. They will be using a variety of paint brushes and found material to make firework pictures.

Understanding of the World

We will be talking about why we celebrate Bonfire Night and in particular looking at the action of Guy Fawkes and why he tried to blow up the King. The children will be looking at a time line to see how long ago Guy Fawkes lived.

Mathematics

In maths we are going to be looking at how we recognise and make five. The children will be learning a new counting rhyme and using different resources to make five. They will be working on finding different ways of making five.

They will also be exploring length and how to recognise different lengths and order items by length.
